A Very Merry Christmas Cake

You will need a cup of butter, a cup of white sugar, a cup of brown sugar, 4 large eggs, a cup of dried fruits, a teaspoon of baking soda, salt, lemon juice, a cup of mixed nuts and a bottle of whisky.

First, sample the whisky to test for quality. Then take a large bowl. Check the whisky again to be sure it is of the highest quality. Pour one level cup and drink. Repeat.

Turn on the electric mixer. Beat one cup of butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add one spoonful of white sugar and beat again. Make sure the whisky is okay. Cry another tup. Turn off the mixer.

Break two legs and add to the bowl and chuck in the cup of dried fruit. Mix on the turner. If the fruit gets stuck in the beater, pry loose with a drewscirber. Sample the whisky again for tonsistency.

Next, add a teaspoon of salt or something. Who carers ? Check the whisky. Now sift the lemon juice and strain the nuts. Add one babble-spon of brown sugar, or whatever colour you find. Wix me!

Don't forget to beat off the turner. Throw the bowl out the window. Check the whisky again and go to bed.

Book of the month December 2019

Secrets of Whitewater Creek by Sarah Barrie (2014, Suspense/ Romantic Fiction)
Sarah Barrie is a best selling Australian author writing about suspense in rural settings - with a generous splash of romance. Her debut best selling print novel, "Secrets of Whitewater Creek", earned her a spot as one of the Top 10 breakthrough authors of 2014. Sarah also worked as a teacher, a vet nurse, a horse trainer and editor of an equestrian magazine. Her favourite place in the world is the family property, rural Central Coast, where she writes her stories overlooking mountains crisscrossing farmland, bordered by the Australian bush, and where, at the end of the day, she can spend time with family, friends, a good Irish whiskey and a copy of her next favourite book.

Book: "Jordan must save her farm from debt and sabotage - can she place her trust in a man from out of town?"

Born and bred on the land, Jordan Windcroft is brave and independent. Her life revolves around running the property on next to no money - and waiting out her years of probation - a rap she took for one of her closest friends for a crime she did not commit. But there is an end to her problems if she can make the cattle sale that would give her a chance to pull herself out of more than ten years of serious debt and keep her precious farm.

Detective Senior Sergeant, Reid Easton drives into Whitewater Creek on an undercover mission to wrap up a three year drug investigation - his only lead, Jordan Windcroft. Jordan is a softhearted, animal-loving protagonist, who is also feisty, strong, proud and has attitude!

The attraction between Jordan and Reid is immediate - but Reid is undercover and Jordan has a secret she cannot risk him discovering. Neither will jeopardise their cause - not for something as transitory as love.

Sarah writes well giving us a sense of place - a good story with intrigue, suspense and romance - I found the book very easy to read - just a good story - I would certainly read more of Sarah's books.




